

STREET OUTREACH

Our Street Outreach Program Drop-In Center provides youth experiencing homelessness with hot meals, laundry facilities, showers, computer and phone access, and a safe space to connect with support systems. Established 1995. Located at 402 St. Francis Dr.

- ◆ 272 youth served
- ◆ 4,419 hours of case management
- ◆ 10,725 survival items handed out including groceries, first aid kits, sleeping bags, tents, tarps, clothing, and hygiene kits



COMMUNITY COUNSELING

Our therapists provide counseling for youth in every program as well as youth in crisis throughout Santa Fe County. Many are homeless, at risk of becoming homeless, or otherwise in crisis. Established 1996. Located at 5686 B Agua Fria St.

- ◆ 134 clients and families served
- ◆ 1,056 hours of counseling

PREGNANT & PARENTING YOUTH ASSISTANCE

Our Parenting Program supports young parents achieve and maintain stable mental health, find appropriate child care, develop strong parenting skills, and build knowledge to establish age-appropriate routines and activities. The program also provides baby supplies for each family. Established 2006. Located at 5686 B Agua Fria St.

- ◆ 53 youth and children served
- ◆ 492 hours of targeted case management

YOUTH EMERGENCY SHELTER

Our 24-hour shelter is a safe haven for youth in crisis, serving ages 10-17. The Shelter addresses health needs, mental health support, safety, education, and basic life skills development. Established 1980. Located at 5686 A Agua Fria St.

- ◆ **104 youth served**
- ◆ **1,956 shelter nights**
- ◆ **5,540 hours of life skills and case management**



COLD WEATHER SHELTER

The Cold Weather Shelter serves youth 18-22 and offers warm meals, clothing, hygiene items, case management, and access to housing opportunities. Established 2017. Located at 4435 Airport Rd.

- ◆ **14 youth served**
- ◆ **403 shelter nights**
- ◆ **443 case management hours**

TRANSITIONAL LIVING

Our Transitional Living Program is a supervised independent living campus that supports youth ages 17-22 in gaining community connections, life skills, employment, educational advancement, and counseling as they work towards their self-determined goals. Established 1990. Located at 4435 Airport Rd.

- ◆ **21 young people served**
- ◆ **1,218 hours of life skills and case management**
- ◆ **3,304 bed nights**

PREVENTION, DIVERSION, AND CRISIS HOUSING

Emergency financial assistance and temporary crisis housing.

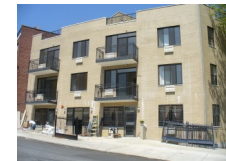
- ◆ **32 youth served including dependent children**



RAPID REHOUSING

Our Rapid Rehousing Program is a low barrier program. Unaccompanied youth from ages 18-24 and their dependents are offered up to 24 months of rental assistance and case management with the goal of maintaining permanent housing at discharge. Established 2016. Located throughout Santa Fe County and expanding to Los Alamos, Sandoval, McKinley, and Cibola Counties.

- ◆ **102 individuals served including dependent children**
- ◆ **2,966 hours of life skills and case management**



FOOD PANTRY

The Food Pantry provides a free weekly food bag for youth ages 25 and under. Established 2018. Located at 5686 B Agua Fria St.

- ◆ **40 clients - 1st Quarter**
- ◆ **28 clients - 2nd Quarter**
- ◆ **67 clients - 3rd Quarter**
- ◆ **68 clients - 4th Quarter**
